- Make a short presentation about your project at a Lake Union Rotary Club meeting (held at 7:30 am on Fridays at the Center for Wooden Boats, 1010 Valley Street, Seattle, 98109; Zoom presentation possible upon request)

We favor projects that are sustainable, have measurable benchmarks to document benefits, and include matching dollars to amplify our contribution's impact. See Rotary website <a href="www.5030grants.com">www.5030grants.com</a> for information and forms required for "District Matching Grants."

## We will not fund grants:

- For unspecified amounts, tuition, general operation costs including salaries, funding beyond one year, or grants
  which involve a conflict of interest.
- That are inconsistent with Rotary principles and Seattle city ordinance, where the project, whether through its principal agents or partners, discriminates on the basis of race, color, sex, age, disability or national origin, gender identity, marital status, political ideology, religion, sexual orientation, or military status or veteran status. (Unless such discrimination involves a lawful means of targeting specific beneficiaries.) To avoid any doubt on this issue, if any organization implementing the grant discriminates in employment on the basis of religion this will generally disqualify the grant.

Final grant approval is contingent on availability of grant funds, and after presentation and approval by our Lake Union Rotary Club Board.
